Winners will be contacted via email or phone. Entries listing the correct location for all of the treasures will be entered in a drawing for gift certificates.

HINTS: All details are on buildings located in the Downtown Washington Historic District (Streets include: Front, Main, Elm, Cedar, Lafayette, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th Streets) or are on individual listings on Jefferson and 2nd Streets, adjacent to the Downtown District. All details are visible from a public street or sidewalk.

CAUTION: For your safety and the safety of others, we ask that you **do not** participate from your vehicle. We ask that you view the architecture details on foot.


